John McIntyre, (It is spelled 'McIntire' in The History of Enterprise in Harrison County) was born in Pennsylvania - probably Philadelphia as that's where his father, Charles, came to from Ireland about 1760. He married Rachel Rose and came to Va (now W.V.) presumably with his parents. The McIntyres laid claim to property at Enterprise, "The District of West Augusta", Harrison Co. Va. The claim extended from what is now the Harrison-Marion County Line and what is now St. Route #19 to the Big Elm farm near Shinnston.

The McIntire Blockhouse was built just south of the town limits of Enterprise and to the west of Rt. #19. There is a roadside sign erected near the location of the new bridge to the west side of the West Fork River. The blockhouse was torn down about 1984. A house now stands where the original McIntire home was located. It's doubtful that it would be the original home. However a new house has been built on the site of the blockhouse and is occupied by Harry McIntire - a descendant.

John and Rachel lived on Nutter Ridge and had five children. Nutter can now be reached from Enterprise or from Pingamon Run (Long Run on map). They did day work for people in Enterprise. One evening they were returning home from their day's work when they were attacked by the Indians. John was scalped. Rachel was taken by the Indians who were pursued by some town's people. This was in 1791. Some historians pinpoint it May 11. The Indians were chased to the Ohio River as this was their permanent home. (They camped near or between Harrison and Mingoahela Counties in the summer) After a skirmish near the Ohio River, the Indians retreated. Rachel's scalp was found in the debris. John and Rachel were buried in a peach orchard between the West Fork River and Rt. #19 in an unmarked grave. A new house has been built at or near where they were thought to be buried. The bonnet that Rachel wore is enclosed in a glass container at the home of Clair Hess, Mannington, W.V. John & Rachel's granddaughter married Henry Hess.
